## Chapter 7: The Yoga of Knowledge and Direct Experience

## Krishna speaks:

7.1 Under My complete protection, practicing yoga with your mind intent on Me, O Child, hear how to know Me fully, beyond doubt.

7.2 To you I shall grant both knowledge and the direct experience of the true Self. When you know this, there is nothing else to be known.

7.3 Of many thousands, perhaps one tries to attain perfect knowing.Of those few seekers, perhaps one achieves My true reality.

7.4 Indeed earth, water, fire, air, space, sensory mind, intuition, and the sense of "I am" are the eight parts that form My own nature.

7.5 From this more crude nature, know that I have a distinct, higher part: the very life-force, Mighty One, by which this whole world is sustained.

7.6 These dual natures are the womb from which every living thing springs. I am the source of the cosmos and also its dissolution.

7.7 There is nothing greater than I. O Mighty Prince of Worldly Wealth, the cosmos is strung upon Me like gems knotted upon a thread. 7.8 O Kunti's son, I am the fresh taste of water, light of the moon and the sun, "Om" in sacred lore, sound in space, prowess in humans.

7.9 I am the scent of fresh-turned earth, the blaze of fire, the life in all living beings and the restraint of those who observe stringent vows.

7.10 O Arjuna, know that I am the timeless seed of all beings, the wisdom of the wisest men, the light of the illumined ones.

7.11 I am the might of the mighty, when untainted by crude desire.Best of Your Race, I also am desire unopposed to duty.

7.12 Know that both ends of light's spectrum and all the colors in between come from Me. I am not contained by them, although I contain them.

7.13 Fooled by the illusions painted by Nature's primary colors, this whole world does not know Me as changelessly beyond all of those.

7.14 Indeed, My divine illusion, formed of elemental forces, is difficult to go beyond unless you take refuge in Me.

7.15 The evil and the deluded, the vilest men, their wisdom robbed by this illusion, seek Me not, but follow a demonic path. 7.16 O Arjuna, there are four types of noble ones who worship Me: the stricken, seekers of knowledge, seekers of wealth and the wise ones.

7.17 Of these, the wise man constantly devoted to the One excels, for I am very dear to him, and he, in turn, is dear to Me.

7.18 Surely, all four types are noble, but the wise one is like My Self, in My opinion. That steadfast soul lives in Me, his highest goal.

7.19 His many rebirths finally lead to Me. That great soul who knows that all is but the inner Self is very difficult to find.

7.20 With their wisdom torn by desire for this and that, men cling to rites of this or that lesser godling, as constrained by their own nature.

7.21 Whoever, whatever a man decides to entrust with his faith, I surely take that faith and make it inexhaustibly steady.

7.22 Endowed with faith, he engages in worship of his chosen form, and from it he gains his desires, which are, in fact, granted by Me.

7.23 The rewards gained by those who have little wit have their limits. Those who worship gods go to those gods, but My devotees come to Me.

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7.24 I am the Unmanifested. Those fools who think Me embodied know not My higher nature as eternal and superior.

7.25 I am not manifest to all. Deluded by my illusion, this foolish world does not know Me, the one unborn and beyond death.

7.26 O Arjuna, I know of all the beings that have been and that are now and that are yet to be. But not a single one knows Me.

7.27 The pairs of opposites such as attraction and aversion snare all living beings at their birth, O Child of Hope, Scorcher of Foes!

7.28 But those whose sins have been destroyed, who act with virtue, freed from the delusion of the opposites, worship Me, steadfast in their vows.

7.29 Those who seek liberation from old age and death, who turn to Me, find full knowledge of the Supreme, the inner Self and all action.

7.30 Those who know Me as the essence of gods and world and sacrifice, steadfast in mind, they will know Me even at the moment of Death.
